

What is the forum for?

The forum is for connecting CARE members for structure exchanges and sharing information about age criteria, useful research, and preparation techniques for aging.

How do I sign up?

If you are a new user: Register yourself and set your password. You will get a confirmation sent to your email. Along the top bar, hit Login and enter your email and password. Then you're good to go! You may start in a read-only mode. This is to limit spambot accounts from posting in the forum. One of the moderators will approve your access to post in the forum.

What are all the headings for?

These headings are subforums, and they're used to organize the discussions into different topics.

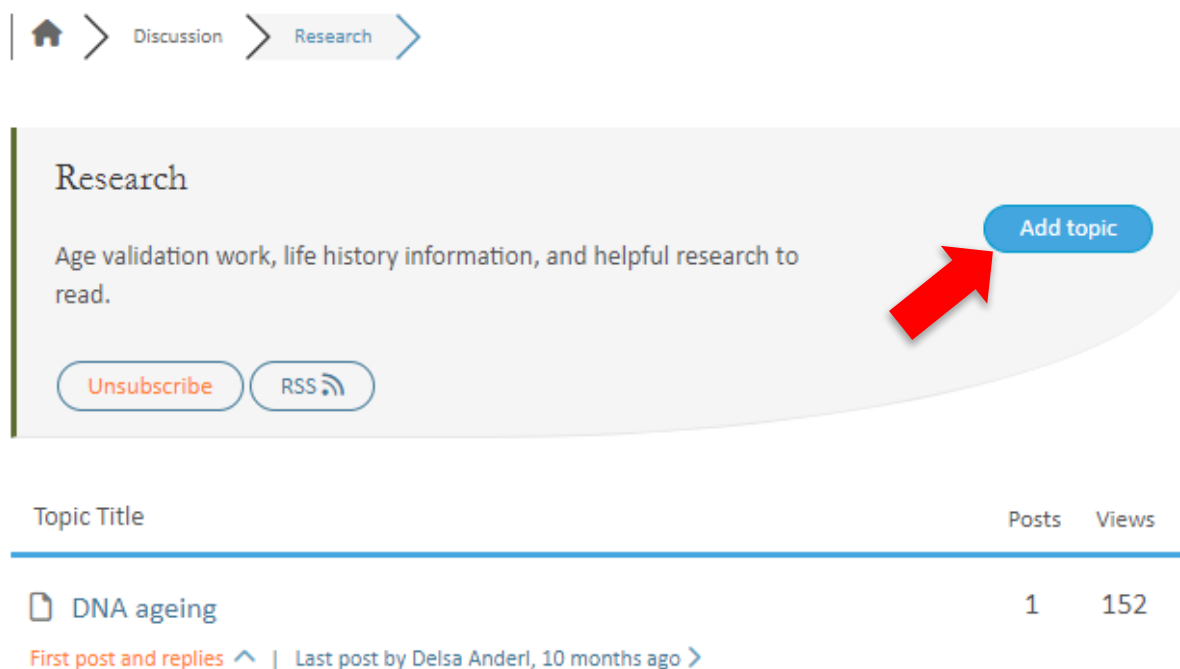

How do see what people are talking about?


Within each subforum are different topics, where folks can pose questions or ask for advice and resources. The topics are highlighted by their titles – click on the topic to reveal the discussion and comments, who posted them, and when. The structure is similar to an email chain – scrolling down reveals comments in chronological order.

How do I start a discussion?

Click on the subforum you would like to contribute a question or discussion towards. You will see an “Add Topic” button close to the top.
